The deadline for abstract submission is February 6th, 2023 and for final papers July 6th, 2023, but Frontiers' fast-track review process, led by the editorial team, means each article is published online as soon as it's been successfully peer-reviewed and accepted (typically within 61 days).

We would like to point out explicitly that frontiers is a purely open access journal. As an open access journal, publishing fees are applied to accepted articles. Please contact

ai.submissions@frontiersin.org to discuss fees, institutional waivers, and discounts.
